Remarks from Pastor Allison



December 12th is our virtual Charge Conference with our District Superintendent Debra Brady. Look for the Zoom link in your email the week before it is scheduled.

This will in all likelihood be your first Charge Conference by Zoom. It is mine! This year is full of firsts, not all of them welcome. I had a Zoom Thanksgiving, eating my dinner at the table in Tulare as my sister, brother-in-law and one niece ate at their table in Houston. It was a much smaller gathering for them than the usual houseful they host!

As we begin the season of Advent and approach Christmas, there will be other firsts for us. Our recorded worship features families at home lighting the Advent candles. We are working on a virtual Christmas pageant. Our in-person worship is outdoors (which is actually quite comfortable at 11 AM!). Christmas Eve worship will probably be in the afternoon. Lots of firsts.

It's tempting to say "Bah! Humbug!" to these changes and look forward to when we can reclaim our Christmas traditions, but I've realized that not all the firsts are so bad. In fact, God is at work in them, inviting us to see things from a new perspective. Because we can't meet at church, we have had to think creatively about how to bring Advent and Christmas activities home. Our Christian Education team did a FABULOUS job assembling home kits for families with all kinds of activities from making an Advent wreath with cut outs of hand prints to an Advent garland for the Christmas tree or mantle. We have sent out devotions that bring the light of Advent through the Advent wreath and daily devotions centered around our worship series "Incarnation."

We have also marshalled the connection of other Methodist congregations in creative ways. Church of the Resurrection and Rev. Adam Hamilton are incredibly generous in sharing their resources. The churches in our conference continue to produce wonderful videos and resources (look for a great one in your email about sharing Christmas movies with the children in your life.) And there are a number of churches who are also doing the "Incarnation" series that will gather for study together. We will continue our Wednesday night time and I have already had people from other parts of the country asking if they can join us!

We are being tempted to see only what we don't have, what we fear we have lost. I join Jesus in saying, "Get thee behind me, Satan!" No one and no virus can take away the most important part of this season, namely the reason for the season – Jesus. No one and no virus can rob me of the hope, peace, joy and love I have in him. Yes, this Christmas will be different from other Christmases. I pray that it opens up new ways for you to connect to the One whose birth we celebrate and show his love to others.
