#### Walk to Emmaus Invitation

Have you ever wondered what it must have been like to have been one of the two who were walking on the road to Emmaus? While they were talking with each other a stranger, Jesus himself, came to walk with them but they were kept from recognizing HIM. They spoke of how Jesus was recently condemned and crucified. He then interpreted things about himself in all the scriptures. They invited HIM to stay for it was almost evening. While at the table with them, he took the bread, blessed and broke it and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he opening the scriptures to us?"

This story from Luke 24:13-35 in the Bible provides the imagery for the Walk to Emmaus Christian retreat. The retreat is a 72 hour experience that begins on a Thursday evening and ends on a Sunday evening. There are both a spring and fall retreat that is held at local churches within our central valley. Although everyone's experience is different, something you can expect is to come away with an even stronger spiritual life and a desire to be active in leadership within your own local church and community. Landes and I were sponsored for this retreat in 2013 and we have been ever so grateful for having had this opportunity. I had reservations about going at first because I had very little information about what the weekend would be about. All I knew is that I would be in this place with people I didn't know and that it might feel pretty awkward. Well, I decided to trust God and was so elated that I went. After having had this experience I now understand why you do not have a lot of details prior to the walk. The best way to describe it is that the weekend is like a gift, if you knew what was in the gift before you opened it you wouldn't get to experience the excitement and joy that you receive as it is unwrapped!

Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Tulare United Methodist Church,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. My thoughts and prayers are with during this blessed Seasons of Advent. It is with great joy that I inform you that, after much prayer and consultation, it is Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño's intent to appoint the Reverend Marcelo Escárzaga to serve as your Pastor for Hispanic MInistry effective January 1, 2020. He will serve your congregation 1/4-time.

I know that you are already familiar with Pastor Marcelo since he has been working with your congregation over the last 18 months in planting the seeds for new ministry. As you may know, Pastor Marcelo also serves the Vida Nueva congregation in Porterville 1/2-time. His wife Corazon Moran is the Associate Pastor at the Visalia UMC and they are parents of four children. The family resides in Porterville.

Your Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) and Hispanic Ministry Council applied for a grant from our Conference Committee on Hispanic-Latino Ministry and you were awarded \$7,500 toward Pastor Marcelo's compensation for the first half of the 2020 calendar year. We will assess your progress and make a recommendation on the second half of the year as we discern new pastoral appointments for July 1st. Your SPRC and Hispanic Council will work with Pastor Marcelo to develop ministry goals including plans for evangelism and discipleship.

Bishop Carcaño and her Cabinet congratulate you for your vision and these important steps for new ministry. When I worshipped with you last month, I was delighted to see the refurbished space that will support worship and administration as you continue to welcome your Hispanic-Latino neighbors and accompany new people in the life as Christ-followers.

Please continue to support and fervently pray for Pastor Marcelo and all those who lead your Hispanic Ministry. Pray that God will prepare the way work in the hearts of people who are longing for God's grace and love. Pray for the whole congregation as you continue your growth as a welcoming and nurturing community. I look forward to hearing what God will do in and through you in the new year.

#### Member of the Month Heione Tautuaa by Veisinia Tautuaa






