Mary's Musings

I remember my first Ash Wednesday as a Christian. Oh, how heavy the world felt as I entered the Sanctuary of First United Methodist Church in Sacramento on a sunny noon day in March. I might as well have been Marley's ghost, dragging the chains of my sin and failings, bent over from the burdens of my humanity. I believed in Jesus Christ, but wasn't sure how to move forward in faith. Then, the Pastor spoke these words: "I invite you in the name of the Church, to observe a holy Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word." A holy Lent! That's what I needed! A season devoted to seeking freedom in Christ, to shedding the must-haves, shoulds, and have-tos, to spending extra time with the Lord in

pursuit of the new beginning He wanted for me. After receiving the sign of the cross in ash, I organized my life around everything the Church had to offer – prayer circles, Bible Study, healing services. I determined to read the Bible from cover to cover before Good Friday. And I prayed. Jesus Christ died to free us from sin and death. I prayed that He would free me. By Easter I was a new person, with wings instead of chains.

We joined over 200 others from the United States and Canada and one woman from China! There were 146 congregations represented. United Methodists comprised 21 of those. Numerous

denominations sent members and several Roman Catholic parishes sent delegates as well.

The training was condensed into 6 days and to say it was intense is an understatement!! We listened. We discussed. We took copious notes - it was almost like being back in college. We participated in role playing. We sang. We prayed. We met many new people and formed friendships. And we drank many, many cups of coffee!! Our brains were filled to capacity.

We have come away from this experience impressed with the scope of this ministry and excited about implementing this program in our church. As the early spring unfolds, you will be hearing much more from us as we begin to set this program in motion. We will be training and organizing members of our church to provide one on one care to those members who are undergoing difficult times in their lives - grief, illness, job loss, loneliness or other struggles. Our ministers will not be trained to fix problems but will be enabled to walk along with those who are hurting. Our goal will be to help these people to feel God's love.

We will keep you informed of our plans as they begin to take shape. Pastor Mary, Connie and I are anxious for this plan to flourish here at our church and we ask for your prayers as we begin to lay the foundation for the training that will begin soon.

Devotions at Twin Oaks 2pm Tuesdays – a time of Scripture, conversation, and prayer; we also bless prayer shawls and blankets for those in need of comfort; we recently blessed 12 prayer blankets for Tulare County Hospice to give to those who are nearing the end of their lives.

Excerpt from Pastor Mary's sermon February 17, 2019 regarding the Special General Conference of the United Methodist Church February 23 – 26th in St Louis on the subject of human sexuality. Complete sermon is in the office. Pastor Mary welcomes conversations about this subject.

"What I am careful of, and what I want to caution all of you against, is sitting in judgment of anyone's faith. I have been in ministry with people in prison who have deep abiding faith, and I have sat with rich people who appeared to have none. But I did not call the rich man out, because faith is ultimately between a believer and their Savior. Those who want the full inclusion of homosexuals in the life of the United Methodist Church are not less Christian than those who want to see them excluded from leadership – we simply use different traditions, different experiences, and different reasoning to understand the Scripture passages that address homosexuality. That's at the heart of what it means to be United Methodist – we bring our full arsenal of intellect, feeling, and history to address any given social issue. We have done it in the past with regard to slavery, prohibition, divorce, civil rights, and women in ministry. And now homosexuality.

This dispute comes down to an ancient conflict in Christianity between those who identify as Gospel Christians, wanting to embrace all the excluded, marginalized, last, least, and lost of the world, just as Jesus lived and taught vs. Holiness Christians, who want the purity and disciplines of the faith to be strictly upheld in order to fight against conforming to the world and the devil's ways, just as Paul wrote. Both sides of this conflict have Scripture and tradition on their side. Neither is complete without the other, in my opinion, but in the midst of these historic fights on social issues the sides get driven to the extremes, which is where the ugliness happens.

I hate the extremes in religion and in politics. I hate the extremes because of the self-righteousness and judgment that always comes with extremism. In order to combat any potential for that in me, about a year ago I asked Steve Creel, the pastor at Visalia UMC to join me in a spiritual exercise around this issue. We wrote letters back and forth stating our theological and Scriptural position on the issue of homosexuality, using the quadrilateral (reason, experience, tradition) to the best of our ability – once a letter had been written we would come together and read the letter out loud. We wrote passionately and honestly and as we read our letters to each other over the course of many months, there began to settle over us humility and awe. We disagree, but are unified in Christ. We do not question one another's faith or commitment to the Lord. We each as pastors may end up in different denominations, representing opposing views on this particular issue, but we are united in our confession that Jesus Christ is Lord. That alone fills me with humility and awe.

I don't have a crystal ball, so can't predict what will happen in St. Louis later this month. What I promise you is that I will learn everything I can, read everything that comes to me, and share with you everything I know when we meet as a congregation on <u>March</u> <u>3rd at 2pm.</u> In the meantime, prayers, abundant prayers."
