Remarks from Pastor Allison

I am now fully vaccinated! I received my second Pfizer dose on April 9th, and after two weeks, I am told I have reached full immunity from COVID-19. I hope that you will also avail yourself of the vaccine, if you have not done so yet. There are appointments available throughout Tulare County.

As the light at the end of the tunnel gets brighter and the future promises to be more than masking and social distancing, I am taking advantage of programs that our Conference offers to help pastors and churches navigate the future. In February, Pastor Marcelo and I began a year-long Church Planters Academy, launched by the Conference

two years ago to help cultivate pastors called to start new churches and/or ministries. I have never felt called to plant a church, but I believe that God called me to Tulare to help us start new ministries. I feel especially drawn to the increasing numbers of "spiritual but not religious" and believe that our church and our Methodist theology has a lot to offer them to connect them to God and to make a disciple for Jesus Christ. It's still early days in this learning process; we've only met four times via Zoom, but God is planting seeds with me and with others in the cohort.

I also began a shorter (six week) course last month offered by the Barna Group. Barna is a company that I think of as the Gallup for Christians and churches. They do stellar national survey research and publish articles and books detailing and interpreting the data. This course is to help churches navigate "hybrid" ministry – both the in-person and digital worlds. It is tempting to think that when all restrictions are lifted that we won't need much digital presence, but most pastors realized early in the pandemic that a true paradigm shift occurred last year as we were all forced to launch digital church life. Now, we are asking what will a hybrid life look like in the church. Some of you took an assessment to help me understand where we are, and I thank you. I will be using that information in future sessions of the course, and I will bring it to our Church Council to talk about the future. If you want to be part of the conversation, let me know. I'd love to talk to you one-on-one and you are welcome at the next Church Council meeting after church on May 16th.

The Spirit is clearly at work here because already I see how the Academy and the Barna course are overlapping and informing each other; they aren't separate but connected. I am excited to see what God is revealing through them.

There is still so much I don't know about Tulare, either the community or the church, and you are going to be an important part of my learning. Don't be surprised if I invite you to lunch or stop by to listen for your wisdom and insights.

EXAMPLE 1 We are studying the book of Daniel, one of the last books of the Old Testament to be written. It tells the story of a talented young Jewish man who lives in exile in Babylon after Judah was conquered. He and a number of others are selected to be educated to serve their Babylonian conquerors. Yet, he remains faithful to God and his faith, and God blesses him despite hostility and opposition from the ruling powers. 

> UMW District Retreat Saturday, June 19th 10 AM to 12:30 PM Who Do You Say I Am? Luke 9:18-20

The New Testament calls Jesus by many names: Son of God, Son of Man, Messiah, Christ, Savior, Lamb of God, the Good Shepherd, Light of the World. Jesus calls himself our friend and Paul says he is our brother. These names reveal who Jesus is and what he came to do. Some names will resonate with us more strongly at different periods in our lives.

In this retreat we will ask ourselves who do we say Jesus is at this moment in our lives. We have lived through an unprecedented event over the last year and a half. Who has Jesus been for you during a time of pandemic? How has your understanding of who he is changed in that time? Perhaps the name by which you knew him best brought comfort, or perhaps you discovered that you were drawn to a different name. How did that name help you survive the pandemic? And, as we emerge from the worst of it, what name speaks to your soul?

We invite you to pray about the names of Jesus over the next few weeks and reflect upon the name that has been most helpful in recent days. Search for an object that reflects that relationship and bring it to the retreat with you. We will invite you to share it and how it reflects who Jesus is for you. For example, if Jesus as Savior has been the name that has spoken most deeply to you, you might share a cross with us. Surprise us with your imagination!
