Mary's Musings

When I was in sixth grade my father moved me to the elementary school where he was the principal. I think the reason was because my homesickness during the previous school year had become debilitating. At my father's school I could go to the office anytime and touch base. I remember it being a wonderful school year. I did a report on Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King that I was very proud of – in fact, still had it until just this past year when the kids and I sold our family home. I also volunteered in the special education classroom where I spent time comforting two autistic children: Joey and Chris. It was a source of pride to me that sometimes when Joey or Chris would get severely out of control, a voice would come over the loud speaker asking me to report to the special education room. I learned that I have a gift of getting through to people who are lost or frightened. Sixth grade

was also the year that I had my first boyfriend. Ricky had cerebral palsy and was confined to a wheel chair. I got to push him wherever he needed to go and we always took the long way, talking the whole time. I will never forget Ricky telling me what it was like to always be dependent on others to get his needs met – how he knew to be grateful for the small pleasures of life – like having a pretty girl wheel him around the school. That's when I knew I was his girlfriend. I never saw him outside of school and we never so much as held hands, but my relationship with him showed me how big the world can be, even when it seems to be limited. That's what the Holy Spirit does for me: it allows me to look past the world's limitations to the boundless possibilities for love and gratitude. Blessings, Pastor Mary

No Barriers Bible Study

5 doors open, 5:30 supper, 6-7 Bible Study

Every week we host between 65-100 people for a family style meal in our downstairs social hall. The people who come include families with children from our neighborhood, youth group members, members of our Church, homeless folks, people living in their cars, and members of area Churches. It is a powerful snapshot of the Kingdom of God. Everyone receives a warm welcome and there is conversation and laughter at this once a week Jesus Family Reunion! After our meal we enjoy an hour of Bible Study with Pastor Mary. Yes she talks! (Have you met her?!) But others talk as well and there is always much to be learned about the early Church as we study Acts of the Apostles.

How can you help this powerful outreach ministry? Please donate food items or cash to underwrite our weekly meal. And come be with us! Newcomers are always welcome.

Adult Sunday School – meets in the room behind the Library every Sunday 9am – 9:45am We have been learning about early Church heresies (more fun than it sounds!) and are about to shift to studying a letter of Paul, still deciding which one.... please come be a part of us.

Ministry In spite of significant health challenges, our Jessica Stone continues to reshape the effort to provide clothing to the homeless of our community. Her emphasis includes making the display of clothes and the room itself, a place that says "Welcome" to



anyone coming through the door. She keeps an eye open to seasonal needs, while displaying clothing items that are both functional, and especially useful to those who regularly visit our church. Want to know how Jessica anticipates needs, and shares the love of Jesus Christ? We invite you to walk with her for a moment. Let her thinking inform you about how you can continue to assist in the special outreach ministry of our church.

Ongoing Needs: Socks, shoes (no heels), preferred clothing sizes. (Sm. Med, Lg.) Traveling this summer? How about tooth paste, deodorant, soap? Even Toilet paper, hand sanitizer.

Seasonal Needs: Jessica sets aside, Sweaters, jackets, sweat pants, gloves, caps, ponchos, blankets, flashlights.
